

TASKFORCE PROGRESS

INCE THE LAUNCH of the Mayors Taskforce *for* Jobs in April 2000, the Taskforce has had significant achievements and received some high profile media attention. Mayors from around the country have seen the Taskforce as a way to provide leadership on the crucial issue of jobs in their communities, to support local initiatives and to work together to share successful projects and solutions.

Membership of the Taskforce has grown to 68 (92% of all Mayors), with members covering all regions of the country. The influence and credibility of the Taskforce can be seen in the inclusion on advisory committees for such things as Careers Expo's, the new Youth Transition package announced in the 2004 Budget and the Work & Income Advisory Group for community employment.

Three year funding for Mayors projects has been secured by the Taskforce from the Ministry of Social Development (\$500,000 per year) and The Tindall Foundation (\$500,000 per year).

The Taskforce is seen as a network which knows what is happening in local communities and has ideas and solutions to the challenges of jobs, from unemployment to skill and labour shortages. The Taskforce has been extremely successful in bringing the many and diverse parties to the table and encouraging a collaborative approach to the work in our communities.

In the four years of the Taskforce's existence, youth unemployment has dropped from 39,553 (March 2001) to 19,972 (June 2004).

Focussing on young people, the Taskforce aims have been to:

- engage with, retain, skill and resource young people within communities
- assist communities to reach the potential of all citizens
- work with all agencies and organisations to ensure sound labour market information is used to plan and co-ordinate strategies and solutions to labour market issues

Working alongside Mayors and Councils has proven to be an effective way of solving local labour market problems and being proactive in providing opportunities for young people.

Some examples of where this has made a significant contribution are:

NEW PLYMOUTH

The Mayor has been a champion of the Taskforce goals which has seen their inclusion in the Council's strategic plan.

The community, government agencies and the Council have responded by:

- The establishment of the Taranaki Connections Youth Transition Service
- The provision of jobs for young people in the not-for-profit sector
- The provision of a cadet scheme in the Council
- An increase in apprenticeships within the Council and the community
- A highly co-ordinated and connected community

PORIRUA

The Mayor has been a very enthusiastic supporter of initiatives which will see the employment of young people within the city and region. Her involvement with the Taskforce has seen the development of a number of initiatives:

- A focus on apprenticeships which has seen a collaborative effort from agencies such as Partners Porirua, Porirua Apprenticeship Trust, The Learning Shop and the various government agencies involved in this area
- The development of an Apprenticeship Trust to assist with apprentices in the building area
- A very active Local Employment Co-ordination group which ensures all agencies and community groups are highly networked
- A highly successful Destinations and Tracking project in conjunction with Career Services
- Excellent liaison and support for local secondary schools
- The development of a Youth Transition Service

MANUKAU

There is enormous Council support for employment, education and youth activities which has seen the development of:

- A large cadet programme within the Council
- An education Trust which aims to increase the education attainment of local young people
- A co-operative project in Otara to ensure the population has the skills to take up new opportunities expected from economic developments in the area
- Employment of appropriate staff within the Council to undertake a co-ordination role for government agencies and community groups

CHRISTCHURCH

As the Chair of the Taskforce, the Mayor has championed many youth activities which take place from the local Economic Development Agency – the Canterbury Development Corporation, including:

- Actionworks a youth employment service
- A Destinations and Tracking project within local High Schools
- Work with alternative education providers and early school leavers
- Support for apprenticeships
- Support for the New Zealand Business Council for Sustainable Development's *Youth Employment Guide* and the project within the contracting company City Care
- A Mayoral graduation ceremony for apprentices

SOUTHLAND

All Mayors have worked together under the umbrella of Venture Southland – the local Economic Development Agency – to support a number of initiatives including:

- A pre-employment programme at Borland Lodge
- Cyber Communities project
- Enterprise training
- Effective networking and collaboration between agencies and community groups facilitated by Venture Southland, including a successful community planning day

Key common factors in the success of these initiatives have been:

- The leadership and facilitation of the Mayor
- The availability of appropriate skilled people to work alongside the Mayor
- The involvement of the local Council
- A sound co-ordination mechanism e.g. the local Economic Development Agency, a Local Employment Coordination group, a Mayors Taskforce for Jobs group

Nationwide activities and advocacy of the Taskforce include:

- Promotion of cadet programmes in local and central government
- Apprentice graduation ceremonies
- Local authority participation in Youth Transition Services
- Support for Apprenticeship Trusts
- Increased participation of Industry Training Organisations in Careers Expos
- Collaborative advocacy for increasing the modern apprenticeship programme


3. Advocate Privately with Central and Local Government on Issues that Impact on Youth Employment
